

Two Rivers Public Health Department recently inspected the Lexington Aquatic Center to kick off the outdoor pool season. The TRPHD nursing team was able to assist by providing information on a blood clean up kit and triangle bandage.

This was a great opportunity to build partnerships within the TRPHD district for Katie Mulligan as she was meet and talk to several Parks and Rec workers from Lexington. This pool would be a beneficial location to utilize to train our own team because of the unique features such as having two pools in one location, a bath house, and recent efforts to improve the setting by local pool staff.

### **Pool Season Success**

Two Rivers Public Health Department has completed 15 pool inspections since transitioning to the primary inspection entity on April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025.

Of those, 9 pools are indoor and 6 are outdoor pools. Two Rivers has worked closely with operators to provide reference and educational materials, and is scheduling trainings for large facilities who feel they need more practice and information on chemical testing and recording.







Measles was officially eliminated from the United States in 2000, meaning there is no measles spreading within the country and new cases are only found when someone contracts measles abroad and returns to the country.


However, as of May 29, 2025, a total of 1,088 confirmed measles cases were reported by 33 states, including Nebraska. There have been 14 outbreaks reported in 2025, and 90% of confirmed cases are outbreak-related. For comparison, 16 outbreaks were reported during 2024 and 69% of cases were outbreak-related.

### **Fast Facts**



- Measles is the MOST CONTAGIOUS human virus
- Spreads through the air & surfaces
- The Virus can live up to **2 hours** in the air & on surfaces
- 90% of unvaccinated people exposed will get sick
- Early symptoms look like the common cold
  - These symptoms will worsen over time
- Measles can cause serious complications, including death
- The best way to protect yourself is to get the MMR vaccine

### Signs & Symptoms

Recognizing measles symptoms and getting appropriate medical care is important to help prevent spread of the virus and to prevent severe complications. Measles symptoms can take **7-21 days** to appear after exposure.

#### Day 1-2 (early symptoms)

- Fever
- · Couch Runny nose
- Red, watery eyes

#### Day 3-5

- Rash will start at the hairline or ears, spreading down the body
- White spots inside the mouth (not everyone gets this)
- Symptoms may worsen over time.

#### Severe Symptoms for Young Children

- Blue color around the mouth
- Crying without tears
- Low energy or appetite

#### **Severe Symptoms for everyone:**

- Trouble Breathing or Rapid Breathing
- Signs of severe dehydration
  - Dry nose
  - Dry mouth
  - Low Urination
- Confusion
- Low Energy/Weakness

Measles can cause severe health problems, including:

- Pneumonia
- Swelling the brain (encephalitis)
- · Possibly even death

















#### What to do:

If someone in your family has measles symptoms:

- Keep them away from family members who are not sick.
- Everyone in the house should stay home to not get your neighbors or people outside of your home sick.
- Call a doctor or hospital right away to let them know someone in your home may be sick with measles.
   They will give you instructions.

### Measles

#### When to go to the emergency room:

If the person who is sick gets rapidly worse, or has any of the symptoms listed below, take them to the emergency department of a hospital immediately. DO NOT WAIT.

- Trouble breathing (or breathing faster than normal)
- · Pain when breathing or coughing
- Dehydration (dry nose and mouth, urinating less, crying without making tears)
- Fever or headache that will not stop
- Confusion, decreased alertness, or severe weakness
- Blue color around the mouth, low energy, or difficulty feeding (for young children)

### **Routine Measles Vaccine Recommendations**

0 to 6 months and pregnant women



· Vaccine is NOT recommended

4 to 6 years



 Receive second dose at least 28 days after the first dose

6 to 11 months



 If you are traveling to an outbreak area or internationally, consult your doctor on an early dose 6 years to adult



12 to 15 months



Receive first dose of MMR vaccine



- · Receive first dose immediately
- · Receive second dose at least 28 days later
- · If born before 1957, you are considered immune
