



County Information

Underscored by the Republican river in the southeastern corner, Harlan County is home to a predominantly agricultural community involved in both farming as well as livestock cultivation. Almost all of Harlan County residents were born in the US, the third highest proportion of native-born residents among all Nebraska counties. The 3 largest cities are Alma (County seat), Orleans, and Stamford.
